# **CoA Action Plan Notes**

9/25/25 - Anne Emmet

Most actions are going to hinge on communication with and info about seniors. Do they have phones (reverse 911)? Do they have internet and read emails; one told me on 9/24 that she doesn't read her email much? Other issues - Do they drive? (Should they drive?) Do they have special needs? Do they not want people to know their needs, even at the cost of having services? Do they use available services?

Shelburne Senior Center has many activities and, I think most of the same problems.

They also have a staff, so maybe we should meet with them for their methods and solutions.

### **Domain 1. Outdoor Spaces and Buildings**

Action 1.

Add bench inside door at Jacobs Road. Pat McGahan offered to have Park and Rec put in outside benches if needed; we probably could get them to do this.

# **Domain 2.** Transportation

Action 3. Shelburne Senior Center shares this problem. I believe they have just lost the driver of the van they used for transporting seniors to appointments, etc. (Are there insurance issues associated with volunteers driving through a CoA program?)

### Domain 3. Housing

There are people in Heath who provide services such as rides, errands, cleaning for a charge. There is an advertisement for one on bulletin board at Jacobs Rd.

# **<u>Domain 7. Communication</u>** (Applies to Domains 2 and 3)

Action 2. A trifold Pamphlet/letter listing services and how to reach them. Large print.

Available at Post Office, Community Center, Jacobs Road, Churches, Emergency Room in Greenfield. Notice in Heath Herald that information exists with examples, and says where it's available. I could make a template. Use colored paper - yellow or orange. Action 3. Medium sized Bulletin Board labelled **Senior Information** or something, at Sawyer Hall and Jacobs Rd. Would include box with pamphlets.

Advertisements for services, schedules, contact information. There's a big bulletin board at Jacobs Road, but it's cluttered, out of main site, and covers lots of topics.
